**Answer Key:**

1. B

**Explanation:** Friend = singular noun in the 3rd person; hence 'has' is correct.

2. A

**Explanation:** Last year = shows the past tense; hence 'had' is correct.

3. B

**Explanation:** You = singular pronoun in the 2nd person; hence 'have' is correct.

4. A

**Explanation:** House = singular noun in the 3rd person; hence 'has' is correct.

5. D

**Explanation:** Yesterday shows the past tense; 'had' is correct.

6. D

**Explanation:** Last night shows the past tense; hence 'had' is correct.

7. B

**Explanation:** Sonali = singular noun in the 3rd person; hence 'has' is correct. One never uses the continuous form to show possession.

8. A

**Explanation:** Every Friday shows routine and we = plural pronoun in the 1st person; hence 'have' is correct. Note: Never use the continuous form to show routine.

9. A

**Explanation:** Sunita and her friend = plural noun in the 3rd person; hence 'have' is correct.

10. A

**Explanation:** Yesterday shows the past tense; hence 'had' is correct.
