1. My uncle flies between India and Sri Lanka twice every week.

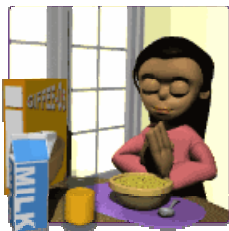


2. The bags weigh between 40 to 45 kilos.

2. Children above the age of 10 were not allowed for the class.

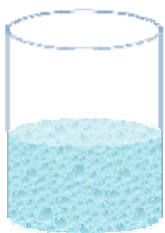


**Below** - at or to a lower level or position than somebody or something

1. They pinned the notice up on the wall.

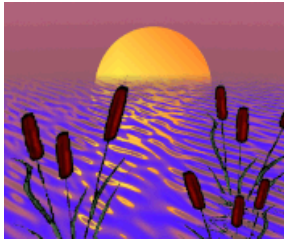


2. He lives up in the mountain.
